MONTANA STATEWIDE ASSESSMENTS FOR 2023-2024 SCHOOL

YEAR:

Highwood School is preparing for the annual administration of the state Mathematics, English Language Arts, and Science Assessments this spring. State assessments play an important role in understanding what our students know and to help identify what resources and supports students need.

- Grades 3-8 will take the Smarter Balanced assessment covering Math and English Language Arts (ELA) during the testing window of March 6th to May 26th.
- Grades 5-8 will take the Science Assessment during the testing window of March 6th to May 26th
- Grade 10 will be taking the Pre-ACT on April 10th.

More information will be sent out as the dates get closer. State and federal law require all students to participate in grade-level assessments for academic reporting. If you have any questions, please reach out to Ms. Bowman at bbowman@highwood.k12.mt.us.

REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES:

It is the expectation at Highwood School that students are in school everyday ready to learn. Public schools are responsible for all their students and are required by law to follow up with a phone call to the parent or guardian if a student is absent without the school's knowledge. In the case of a planned absence, please send a note or make a phone call to the school ahead of time. Please see the K-12 Student Handbook to review the entire attendance policy.

Parents may create a parent account in Infinite Campus to access their children's grades, attendance, and receive instant messages from the school. If you have not created an account or have forgotten your login information, please contact the school office.

SUBSTITUTES, CLASSROOM VOLUNTEERS, BUS DRIVERS NEEDED:

Anyone willing to serve as substitutes in the classroom, kitchen, custodial, or bus driving, or anyone that would like to volunteer in our classrooms should contact Ms. Bowman for more information.

STUDENTS WITH FOOD ALLERGIES:

The breakfast and lunch program at Highwood School is nut free. The school building itself is not a nut-free zone. However, the school is committed to keeping the building safe for all students by prohibiting foods in common areas. If your child has a food allergy and plans to eat breakfast or lunch at the school, the school is required to have documentation of the allergy (from a medical professional) to keep on file. When birthday or party treats are provided in the classroom, students must choose from the list of Highwood School Acceptable Treats. The treat list is included in the student handbook, or you can request a copy from the school office. In order to keep our fleet buses safe, food is NOT permitted on the school bus routes. Food containing nuts are NOT to be opened or consumed on activity buses during school trips. More information regarding the Highwood Public School Peanut/Tree Nut Allergy Agreement can be found in the Student Handbook.

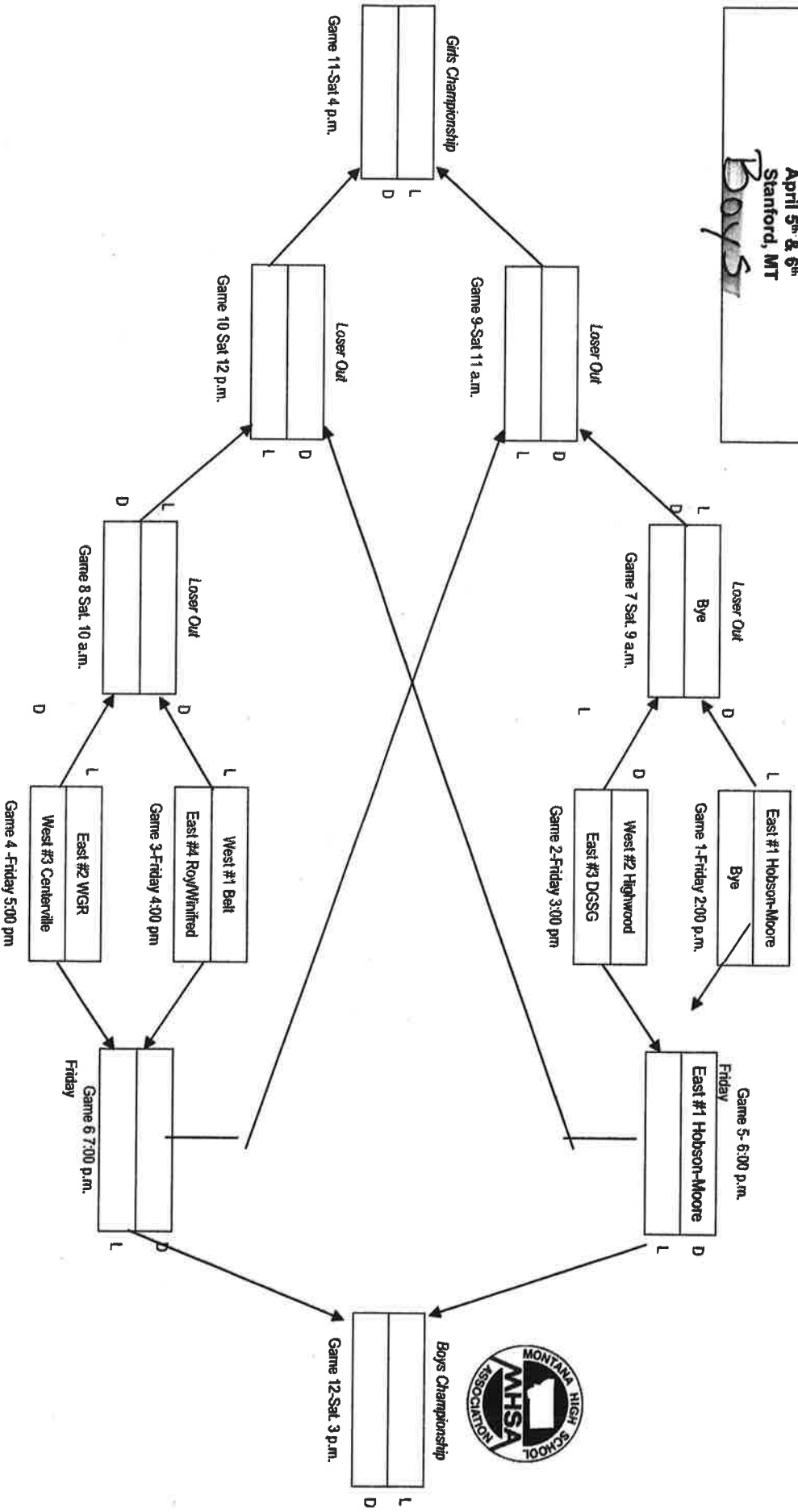

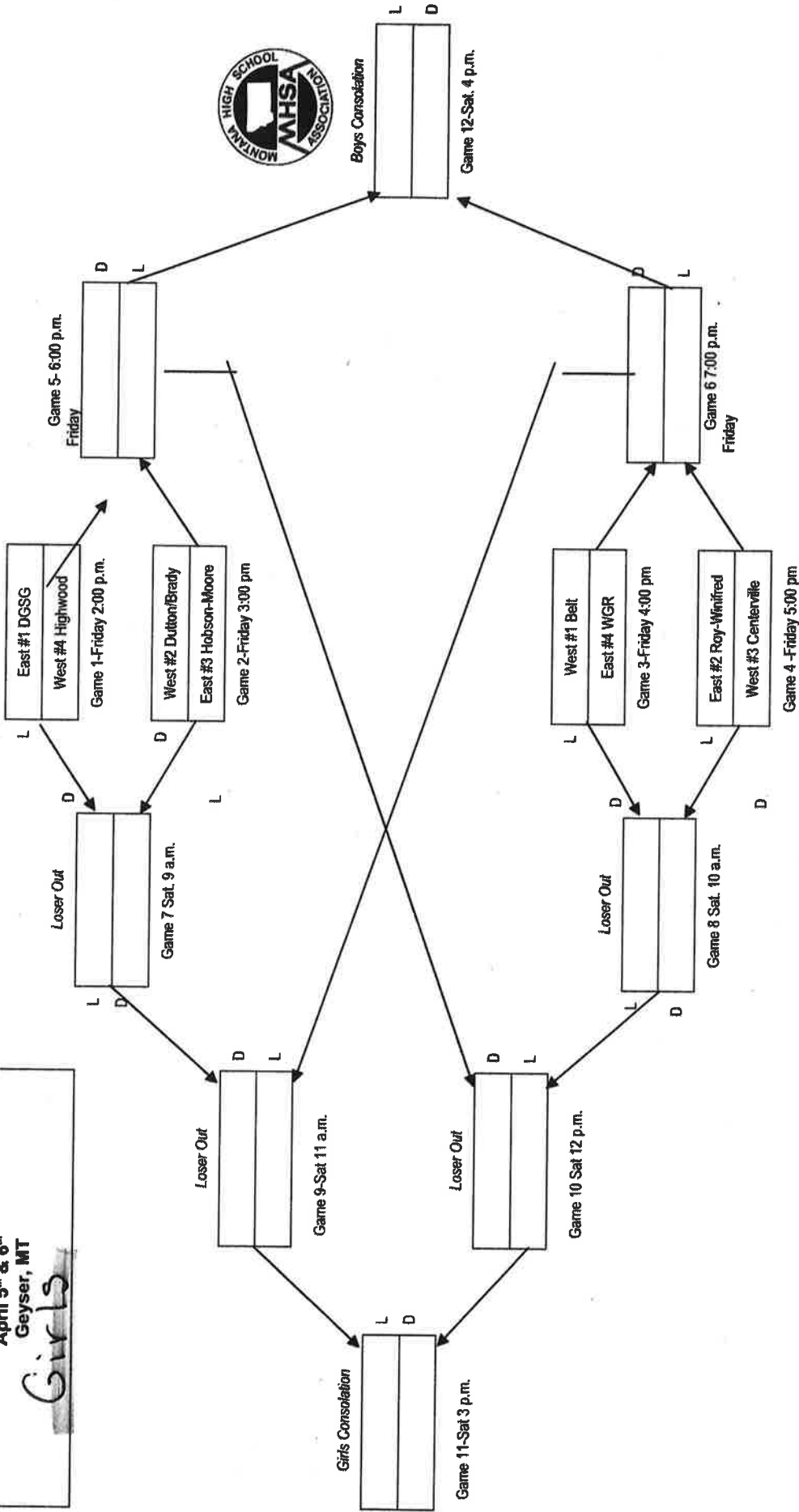
