HUNTER EDUCATION & BOWHUNTER EDUCATION CLASSES: APRIL 29 - MAY 4

Highwood Hunter and Bowhunter Education will run from Monday, April 29, 2024 through Saturday, May 4, 2024. Times for the classes will be from 6:30-8:30 P.M. except on Saturday, May 4, 2024 when class time will begin at 8:30 A.M. until 11:30 A.M. All students and adults born after January 1, 1985, are required to take a Hunter and/or Bowhunter Education Class in order to hunt. Students ages 10 to 11 can take Hunter Education but can only hunt as an apprentice and will not be fully certified until the year they turn 12 years of age. Students that turn 12 years of age by January 16, 2025 can hunt as certified bowhunters. Classes will be at the Highwood Community Hall. To register for classes, go to the website at fwp.mt.gov/education/hunter and register for one or both classes. This will be the only Hunter and Bowhunter Education classes held in Highwood this year.
