MAST Testing Window 1: Grades 3-8

The Montana Aligned to Standards Through-Year (MAST) Program features a series of short, standards-aligned math and ELA tests that are administered throughout the year. The first testing window will be from October 14th to November 22nd for Grades 3-8. The goal of this assessment is to develop a system that provides timely and relevant feedback for teachers and students, as well as comparable summative data for education leaders. This “classroom up” approach will provide flexible opportunities for students to demonstrate learning while providing actionable data to stakeholders.

Reporting Student Absences

It is the expectation at Highwood School that students are in school every day ready to learn. When absence cannot be avoided, parents need to notify the school office of the absence by the start of the school day. Entry Into The School Building

To ensure the safety of the students and staff at Highwood School, all outside doors will continue to be locked from 8:15 A.M. until 3:23 P.M. on school days. People entering the building after 8:15 A.M. need to ring the doorbell and identify themselves. Once inside, all visitors must sign in at the office to receive a visitor badge.



Students With Food Allergies

The breakfast and lunch program at Highwood School is nut-free. The school building itself is not a nut-free zone. However, the school is committed to keeping the building safe for all students by prohibiting food in common areas. If your child has a food allergy and plans to eat breakfast or lunch at the school, the school is required to have documentation of the allergy (from a medical professional) to keep on file. When birthday or party treats are provided in the classroom, students must choose from the list of Highwood School Acceptable Treats. To keep our fleet buses safe, food is NOT permitted on the school bus routes. Food containing nuts is NOT to be opened or consumed on activity buses during school trips. Selective Service

Under Federal law, virtually all men must register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. The Selective Service System also accepts early submissions of registration information by 17-year-old men. The Agency holds their registration information and automatically enters their data into the system when they turn 18. The fastest way to register is online at: www.sss.gov

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid, commonly known as FAFSA, is where paying for college starts. The FAFSA is an application students and families fill out to be considered for federal financial aid, which includes federal grants, loans, work-study, and scholarships. The FAFSA is now scheduled to be available for all students on December 1, 2024. Filling out the FAFSA is the only way to apply for federal financial aid.
